



VICE-PRESIDENT, BUSINESS AFFAIRS (University Operations)

The University of Toronto invites applications and nominations for the position of Vice-President, Business Affairs.

Established in 1827 by royal charter, the University of Toronto is the largest research-intensive university in Canada, located in one of the world's great urban regions. Operating on three campuses with more than 70,000 students, the University is globally renowned for its teaching and research, and ranks third among universities world-wide in total output of academic publications. The annual operating budget is \$1.7 billion, with an additional \$380 million per annum in external support for on-campus research and \$500 million in research funding held by faculty in nine partner hospitals.

The Business Affairs portfolio supports the University's academic mission. The Vice-President has stewardship of the University's financial, information and physical assets and provides services to the academic units. In addition to financial oversight, the Vice-President is charged with the strategic direction of University-wide operations and services including real estate and capital construction, facilities management, and ancillary operations.

Reporting to the President, the Vice-President, Business Affairs is a key leader within the University. Fundamental to the Vice-President's success are the ongoing working relationships with all members of the President's leadership team, divisional academic and administrative leaders, and student leaders across the University, and with a wide range of external constituents.

The successful candidate must have a record of collaborative leadership and innovative management, including success within a complex and decentralized organizational structure. Applicants from a range of disciplinary backgrounds are welcome. For an ideal candidate, the University is prepared to make minor modifications to the scope of functions within the Vice-President's portfolio.

The University of Toronto is strongly committed to diversity within its community and especially welcomes applications from women, Aboriginal persons, persons with disabilities, visible minority group members, members of sexual minority groups and others who may contribute to the further diversification of ideas.

Review of candidates will begin in October 2011, and the new Vice-President will take office January 1, 2012, or as soon as possible thereafter. Applications, nominations, and requests for further information may be submitted in confidence to the address below.
